This could include deities, cults, priests or festivals. Students will contrast the aspects of Roman religion with our modern concept of religion. Students will also compare Roman deities with those of the Greeks.</p> <p><u>Interpretive Reading:</u> Students will finish translating an abridged, prose version of Vergil's Aeneid. Students will translate one Roman myth. Students will also translate two legends from the early days of the Roman Republic.</p>
<p>Essential Questions</p>	<p>With what verbs is the Dative Case usually associated? What is the difference between a subordinate clause and a main clause? How do you determine the antecedent of a pronoun?</p>
