### **Program Goals:**

- SMCPS Head Start will support parent and family involvement and leadership
  through participation and decision-making opportunities in classroom events, parent
  committee meetings, training, and policy council meetings so that parents are
  empowered as advocates and leaders for their children's educational success
- SMCPS Head Start will provide educational services to improve the vocabulary and communication skills of enrolled children to enhance their potential to enter kindergarten with a solid foundation for listening and speaking success



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- SMCPS Head Start will provide educational services to improve the social and emotional skills of enrolled children to enhance their potential to enter kindergarten with a solid foundation for social and emotional success
- SMCPS Head Start will provide educational services to improve the cognitive and academic development of enrolled students to enhance their potential to enter kindergarten with a solid academic foundation

#### Service delivery-funded enrollment of 165 income-eligible students.

- 6.5 hours a day for 80 four-year-olds
- 2.45 hours a day for 68 three-year-olds
- 6.5 hours a day for 17 three-year-olds
- BBES has 3 classrooms, 2 full day four-year-olds, and 1 double-session three-year-olds
- GKES has 2 classrooms, 1 full day four-year-olds and 1 full day three-year-olds
- GHES has 2 classrooms, 1 full day four-year-olds, and 1 double-session three-year-olds

- Frog Street and Frog Street Pre-K
- Conscious Discipline

### Selection Criteria

- 2 spots per classroom allotted to income-eligible students with a disability
- Ranked eligibility clearly outlined

Mrs. Barry-Utzig, the Lead Social and Emotional Teacher, discussed and demonstrated the "Feelings Buddies" dolls used to learn about and discussing feelings, and how the children are learning self-regulation strategies to reach a feeling of "calm".

Ms. Nancy Spinney, Instructional Resource Teacher, went over the instructional curriculum that the students are covering at this point in the year.

- Math: attributes, sorting, and patterning
- Literacy: identifying whether the letters have curved or straight lines, identifying the letters of the alphabet, vocabulary and listening to/retelling stories
- Using incidental learning--learning through play activity
- The upcoming theme for January: Health & Safety
